Skill Building in watercolor:

Description: experienced or New to watercolor, its easy to get frustrated

In **Skill Building, we will explore** how watercolors work and start having fun. Start with good choices of for paper, paints, and brushes. why and how of colors: some color combinations sing; others go to mud. Throughout each class we will do a variety exercise for you to explore how watercolors perform. Students will learn a variety of techniques and skills, coming away with a solid grasp of how to be successful in watercolors, and have fun!

Course Outline: (can be adjusted per needs of class)

May 11, Day 1: the way watercolor works and why. Paper and brush choices. Introduce the 3 basic techniques: washes, wet blending, dry brush. Play around with a variety of materials. Try different textures.

May 18, Day 2: Color choices. know your colors, it's gonna be lots more fun. Warm, cool, opaque, transparent, earth tones, granulated, etc. Create some basic scenes

May 25, Day 3: Layers. How and why, Going from light to dark. What does it mean to save your whites? We will try masking, saving, and lifting. Create scenery with washers

June 1, Day 4: Shapes and shading: hard lines (cubes, etc.) and soft lines (columns, spheres). Create works from still life with shapes

June 8, Day 5: Review composition basics & color choices. Overlapping. Avoiding convergence. Rule of thirds. Create a simple scene (follow along)

Course to consist of five (5) 2-hour sessions.

Materials: *Needed first day

NOTE: some materials will be provided by Katherine (first day only.)

Perhaps you've already got some materials: bring them in and we will see if you can make art with them.

- *Watercolor Paper 9" x 12"
- *Watercolor Brushes nothing smaller than a #6 first day
- *Watercolor Paints preferably a quality brand
- *Small Paint Tray Palette
- *Rigid backing board, waterproof 11" x 14"
- *Tape: Scotch brand magic tape & Blue Painters Tape, Multi-Surface Medium Adhesive
- *Drawing Pencils (2b, 4b, 6b) & eraser (white preferred)
- *Blow dryer

If you find you need some other materials, here are a few I would suggest.

Paints: Professional grade watercolor paints are recommended; however, student grade are fine. Winsor Newton, Artists or Cotman, Daniel Smith, or Schminckle Horadam are all good brands. **Suggestions:**

Brushes: the larger the better. No brushes smaller than a #6 round will be used the first 4 classes. **Suggestions:** 1 1/2 " or 2" wash brush, 3/4" or 1" flat, #6, #8, #12 & #30 round, a flat Chinese Hake.
